Call for Proposals Editor of *Real Estate Economics*

The Board of Directors of the American Real Estate and Urban Economics Association (AREUEA) invites proposals for Editorship of the Association's journal, *Real Estate Economics (REE)*. *REE* was first published in 1973 and is the oldest academic journal focusing on real estate issues and is considered the premier journal for real estate related topics. The journal facilitates communication among academic researchers and industry professionals and improves the analysis of real estate decisions. Articles span a wide range of issues, from tax rules to brokers commissions to corporate real estate including housing and urban economics, and the financial economics of real estate development and investment.

The Editorship is for a three-year term with editorial responsibilities beginning as of January 1, 2011. Proposals should include a description of the qualifications and experience of the editor(s), a statement of editorial philosophy, statement of vision and goals and how editor(s) plan to meet these objectives, the role of the associate editors and reviewers, and a letter from editor(s) sponsoring institution indicating its support of the appointment and for the release time to fulfill the designated editorial responsibilities estimated at 5-7 days per month.

Real Estate Economics receives on average 165 manuscripts per year. All manuscripts are submitted and handled via the BEPress Manuscript System. *REE* maintains a double-blind review process. The journal is published by Wiley-Blackwell four times per year.

Interested persons or groups should submit a brief proposal (ten pages or less) no later than **March 15, 2010**. The proposals will be reviewed by the publication committee and submitted to the AREUEA Board for a decision at their June 3, 2010 meeting in Washington DC. Prospective editors should be prepared to present their proposal in person at the meeting if possible. Inquiries should be directed to Cinda Smith, Executive Director.
