The American Real Estate and Urban Economics Association seeks participation in the 14th Annual International Conference. The conference will be held August 3-5, 2005 in Los Cabos, Mexico. (Airport code for Los Cabos: SJD)

The conference will provide a forum for high-quality research on urban economics and real estate markets in developing, transition and developed economies. Submissions on both the “real side” and on related financial markets are encouraged. High quality papers are sought focusing on any location, including the United States, but papers on countries outside the U.S., or papers involving international comparisons, are especially welcome.

Abstracts should include a discussion of the objective of the proposed paper, the research design and methodology (where applicable), and, if relevant, some discussion of the nature and policy implications of the findings. **Abstracts or completed papers MUST BE submitted via the AREUEA website at www.areuea.org/conferences/papers.phtml (or by following the links to the International Conference). Abstracts or completed papers must be submitted by March 1, 2005 AND must include the following information on the cover page:** Title of paper, two or three key words indicating topic, corresponding author, institutional affiliation, complete address, telephone, facsimile, and email address. Complete information is requested for each additional author.

Those interested in organizing a special session/panel discussion, or volunteering to serve as a session chair or discussant, should indicate interest as soon as possible, and by March 1, 2005 at the latest.
